PLEASE WEAR A MASK

- 4. To your knowledge, within the past 7 days, have you been exposed (within 6 feet or 2 meters) to anyone who has exhibited symptoms of COVID-19?
- 5. Within the past 5 days, have you been tested for COVID and are still awaiting results?
- 6. Within the past 5 days, have you tested positive for COVID?

If your response is YES to any of these questions, please do not come to the church until all symptoms are resolved. Thank you

Special Notice: Once the doors open on September 12, if you test positive for COVID-19 after attending a church service or entering the building for another activity, you are kindly asked to inform the pastor of this occurrence. This is advisable not only to pray for you but also for the safety of the rest of the congregation. The pastor will hold this information in strictest confidence.

WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

Bethesda family, this is the last devotion from the Christian Education ministry. We hope that the previous devotions have encouraged you to stay focused on God and His word through this difficult time. We have been away from our church home for over a year, but Thanks be to God who has kept us, and we know that He will continue to do so as we experience uncertain times.

"The LORD *is* my light and my salvation; Who shall I fear? *Psalm 27:1*

Volume 1: Issue 19

Change is difficult for everyone. But because of the pandemic, we are having to make changes that we could have never imagined. While we don't know very much about what we will all face in the coming days, we do know that God's word is reliable and true. We also know that God is with us, and we are not alone. This is our discipline of faith and we learned it from a man after God's own heart.

When David wrote Psalm 27, he was fleeing from a jealoushearted king who sought to destroy David's life. His future was shaky. Yet David chose to focus on what he knew rather than fretting about what he didn't. David didn't know how his dark situation would turn out, but he knew that the Lord was his light and deliverer. David did not dwell on his personal doubts but on God's dependability.

When we follow David's example, our response to inevitable uncertainty changes to holding on to the truth on which we stand. We may not know everything, but thanks to God's Word, we do know something:

God is good. (Titus 3:4) God is faithful. (Deuteronomy 7:9)

And God is with us. (Matthew 1:23)

And when we walk in the light of those unchanging truths, we find confidence for today even if we don't know what tomorrow will hold. We can't stay fixed on the uncertainty before us, but we can stay fixed on the fact that God is our light and salvation, and we have no need to fear anything. Our confidence to face the future should lie in the promises of God and how capable He is at keeping His promise.



SHARING JESUS "Give praise to the LORD, proclaim His name; Make known among the nations what He has done." (Isaiah 12:4)

(Excerpt from *Our Daily Bread*, August 31, 2021)

Shortly after Dwight Moody (1837-1899) came to faith in Christ, the evangelist resolved not to let a day pass without sharing God's good news with at least one person. On busy days, he'd sometimes forget his resolution until late. One night, he was in bed before he remembered. As he stepped outside, he thought, No one will be out in this pouring rain. Just then he saw a man walking down the street. Moody rushed over and asked to stand under his umbrella to avoid the rain. When granted permission, he asked, "Have you any shelter in the time of storm? Could I tell you about Jesus?"

Moody embodied a readiness to share how God saves us from the consequences of our sins. He obeyed God's instructions to the Israelites to proclaim His name and *"make known among the nations what He has done" (Isaiah 12:4)* Not only were God's people called to *"proclaim that His name is exalted" (v. 4)*, but they were also to share how He had *"become [their] salvation" (v.* *2).* Centuries later, our call remains to tell the wonders of Jesus becoming a man, dying on the cross, and rising again.

Perhaps we heard about God's love when, as Moody did, someone left their comfort zone to talk with us about Jesus. And we to, each in our own way, can let someone know about the One who saves. (by Amy Boucher Pye)


