power to change her life, tears streamed down her face. Now, some weeks later, Brittany was working in a new environment, living proof of the power of Jesus to change lives.

In the context of encouraging believers to be devoted to prayer, the apostle Paul made a twofold request: "Pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should" (Colossians 4:3-4).

Stewardship in the Bible is one of the essential lessons we need to learn as disciples of Christ. But today, stewardship is often misunderstood, partially grasped, or not on anyone's radar at all. In

general, to steward is to manage something someone's behalf. There are several themes associated with stewardship. First Christ owns everything. Secondly, Christ commands us not to love money and to be content with what we have (Heb. 13:5). But he also commands us to work and take care of ourselves and family financially. Thirdly, God expects us to steward the resources He gives to us. God commands to us generously. We should aim to steward our resources in such a way that we may be able to give more. 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 says whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." We encourage you to pray about tithing. God wants us to be good stewards of His church and of what Paul calls, "the manifold grace of God" (1 Peter 4:10). God wants us to give to support the work of ministry and the expenses of the church. But. He has also entrusted to each of us at least one spiritual gift that we should use to the glory of God. He has entrusted these gifts to us so we can use them for the good of His church. God gives us the gifts, the abilities and the opportunities to use the gifts, and He alone must get the glory. In the end, stewardship in the Bible boils down to this question: Who's the Lord of your life? Are you or is the Lord? How do you know? Won't you let God get the glory by utilizing your gifts,

talents and abilities in one of the following ministries:

- Transportation
- Security
- Senior Ushers
- Audiovisual/IT
