How Can I Share the Gospel When I feel Like a Hypocrite?

"How can I share my faith when I feel guilty about my own struggles in the Christian life – when I feel like a hypocrite?" God can do wonders in and through us when we admit that we are not the people He wants us to be and with His help are willing to change. The following is biblically based counsel, that I hope and pray is an encouragement to you.

Honesty about where we are honors the Lord and enables Him to help us.

Psalm 66:18 says, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear." With that in mind, we can come to Him, acknowledge the hypocritical life we have lived and ask for His forgiveness. That honest confession of our waywardness is all God needs to change us and enable us to be used by Him.

Perfect people do not share the gospel, only sinners do.

If you wait until your life is what it ought to be, you will probably never share the gospel. Who of us on any given day would say that our lives have been everything He wanted them to be? 'Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my anxieties; and see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." (Psalm 139:23-24)

Unbelievers are not turned off by Christians whose lives are perfect, but by Christians who act like they are.

They need to know that we are included in **Isaiah 53:6**, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, everyone, to his own way..." We may often get the attention of an unbeliever when we share our own brokenness about our own sin and our gratitude for His forgiveness.

Message From Evangelistic Outreach continued:

It does not take two days to get things right with the Lord; it takes closer to two minutes.

The importance of living a life that honors the Lord cannot be overstated. **(Psalm 66:18)** As you approach a person who has not met the Lord, ask God to forgive you for things in your heart and life that are not right with Him, and ask Him to use you. It is a brokenness of heart that God honors.

If you present the gospel clearly, you are not presenting a perfect Christian. Instead, you are presenting a perfect Savior.

So how can you present the gospel when you feel like a hypocrite?

It is not where you are that matters. It is the direction in which you are headed. Take these five ideas, make them part of your life, and utter a simple prayer, "Use me as a sinner saved by grace to tell people about You, my perfect Savior."

Now sometimes we might mistakenly think that prayer has something to do with skill. Sometimes you hear someone who is very well meaning say "I don't have the Spiritual gift of prayer." But did you know that of all the spiritual gifts listed in Scripture, prayer is not among them? And there's an excellent reason for that. Prayer is meant for all of us. "Why Pray?" "Because you prayed!" "Bend down, O LORD, and listen!" Isaiah 36 and 37. That doesn't mean things will go our way every time we pray, but if we learn to pray proactively---making prayer our "first resort" and not "a last resort" ---we will or may see God do breathtaking things. He wants us to help us lift our eyes above our circumstances so that we can catch a glimpse of His goodness and love. He wants us to pray so that we will get to know Him---and that really is the best part about prayer. True prayer is about so much more than just request or answers---it's about a relationship with the One who will love and sustain us even when the answers don't seem to come.

MOSES – SIGHT AND SOUND THEATRE LANCASTER, PA – SEPTEMBER 28 The time for our Fellowship Excursion to see the production of Moses at The Sight and Sound Theater in Lancaster, Pennsylvania is upon us. REPORT ON THE CHURCH FLOOD

Numerous communities across Ward 5 experienced flooding after the August 14, 2023 rainfall, with areas surrounding Rhode Island Ave N.E. and Mt. Olivet Road N.E. most impacted. This is an excerpt of the incident report conducted by Ward 5 Councilmember Zachary Parker which was sent to us on Friday, August 25, 2023. Mr. Parker reported he has requested information from and met with the leaders of agencies with primary responsibility for emergency preparedness, flood mitigation, and emergency response, including D.C. Water; the Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE); the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA); the Office of Unified Communications (OUC); the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department (FEMS); and the Department of Buildings (DOB). The storm affected both Greater Mount Calvary Holy Church, Bethesda Baptist Church and other businesses and residents. Preliminary responses have been received from DC Water. The Northeast Boundary Tunnel is part of the Anacostia Tunnel System designed to replace the tunnel and drainage system erected during the 1800's. The additional capacity provided by this tunnel will help alleviate flooding in the future. According to DC Water, while not a contractual date, the current anticipated date for completion of the Northeast Boundary Tunnel (NEBT) is September 30th, 2023. We intend to have further conversations with our Councilman, DC Water, the Mayor's Office, and District officials regarding a remedy for the damages we have sustained. Plans are underway to make the necessary repairs. In the meantime, we will continue to put our trust in God alone and encourage each of you to continue to be prayerful and faithful in building God's Kingdom. We will keep the congregation informed of further developments.
